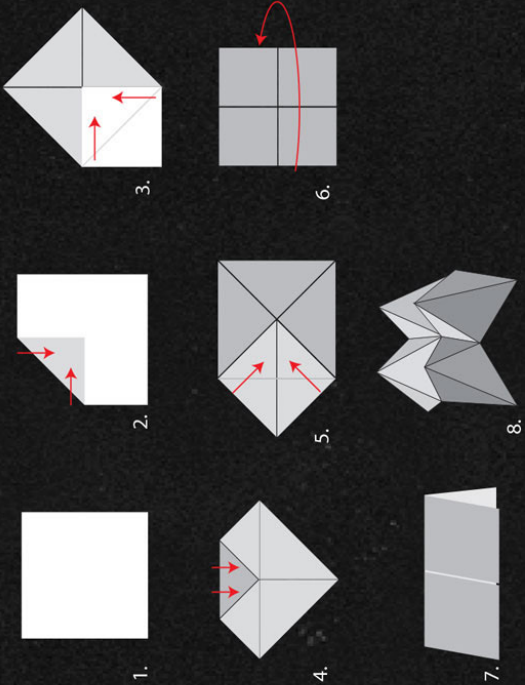

Dingoes are not dogs. They are a special native Australian species who's scientific name is *Canis dingo*.

A dingo's natural diet includes fresh red meat, fish, eggs, carrion and Australian fruits and greens.

Dingoes have large teeth, strong jaws and can open their mouths very wide. This helps them catch food and protect their young.

Dingoes howl, chortle, yelp, whine, chatter, snort and purr. They can sometimes learn to bark from dogs.

Baby dingoes are called cubs. When dingo cubs are young their dad brings food to them and their mum. As they grow he teaches them to survive.

Dingoes can jump 2 metres high, travel 40kms a day, and run 60km/h – that's as fast as a car!

Dingoes have a loyal family unit led by dad & mum. They have babies once a year and mate for life. Grown up cubs help raise their new brothers and sisters.

The widest part of a dingo's body is its head. Their brains are 30% larger than dogs. Dingoes are extremely smart and can live up to 25 years.
